Our Camp Location

Camp Caraway is nestled in the Uwharrie Mountains of North Carolina, with hundreds of acres of natural beauty, scenic views, hiking trails, and a wide variety of recreational activities, including lake activities. Camp Caraway is located at:

Our Speaker

We are delighted to have **Dr. L. Michael Morales**, as this year's camp speaker. Dr. Morales is a minister in the Presbyterian Church in America and serves as Professor of Biblical Studies at Greenville Presbyterian Theological Seminary. He formerly served as Provost and Professor of Old Testament at Reformation Bible College.

Michael is the author of a growing number of popular books on Old Testament studies, including: "The Tabernacle Pre-Figured: Cosmic Mountain Ideology in Genesis and Exodus", Exodus Old and New: A Biblical Theology of Redemption", "Who Shall Ascend the Mountain of the Lord? A Biblical Theology of the Book of Leviticus", and an upcoming commentary on the book of Numbers.

Our Topic

Dr. Morales' will speak on: **Knowing God: The Book of Exodus.** The exodus out of Egypt is the pattern of salvation in the Bible, a redemption that unveils God's glory and foreshadows the greater wonders of the Lord Jesus Christ. Journeying through the Book of Exodus, we will explore the character of God, the nature of our redemption, the great aim of a covenant relationship between God and his people, the role of the Law, and our need for a mediator.

Camp Prices

Our camp prices this year are subsidized by a generous provision of the presbytery. The prices will be (20%) lower than usual, as long as subsidy funds are available. ***These rates will not last long***, so be sure to register early to take advantage of the lower prices. Please note: ***a \$100 fee will be charged for all cancellations***.

The following prices are underwritten by Presbytery, until resources are depleted:

Day campers' one-time fee for the week (includes lunch, supper, and recreation):

First family member: \$430. All additional family members:

Lodging Overview

All lodging will be at Camp Caraway's conference center (marked #1 on map, pg. 8), which has 78 private bedrooms with private baths. They are tastefully decorated, clean and comfortable. The rooms are equipped with linens, towels, toilet paper, irons, and ironing boards, and hair dryers. While there are no TV's or coffee makers in the rooms, reliable high-speed internet is available throughout the building, and a large flat screen TV and courtesy coffee are available 24/7 in the lobby. Those who wish to stay off-site may also attend as day-campers for a lower cost.

Rooms will be available on a first come, first serve basis, and will be assigned according to number of family members and available accommodations. **At the discretion of Caraway staff, larger families may be assigned additional rooms at no extra cost, to meet their needs.** Inflatable mattresses (not provided) may be brought into the rooms to maximize occupancy.

Meals Overview

This year, 11 full meals (Tuesday dinner through Saturday breakfast) are included in the price of the camp. Day guests have lunch and dinner only included in their cost. Camp Caraway's dining room seats 130 with two adjacent private dining rooms that seat 50 each. Campers may also eat in the covered back patio. The meals are served buffet style and the menus typically feature healthy, and delicious southern comfort food. A full salad bar will be served at both lunch and dinner. Dietary needs are gladly accommodated by Camp Caraway's professional staff when requested.

Alternative Food Options

Families may bring in a limited amount of their own food and snacks. Please note: Only a very small amount of refrigerator space available for group use. Families will be responsible to provide their own refrigeration (small refrigerators, coolers).

Allergy Policy and Instructions

All family members with allergies or special dietary needs should include this information on the registration form at the time of registration. All food requests and allergy notifications must be shared with the camp two weeks prior to arrival at camp.

WHAT TO BRING

For Your Lodging:

- Toiletries (soap, shampoo, conditioner, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.)
- Inflatable mattresses and extra sheets and blankets if desired for maximizing lodge occupancy
- Refrigeration for your food (cooler, small plug-in refrigerator, etc.)
- Laundry baskets for dirty and wet clothes (**Note:** washing machines / dryers are NOT available)

Recreation:

- Short sleeved shirts, shorts (for when warm)
- Tennis shoes, hiking boots or shoes
- Plenty of socks
- Long pants, long sleeved shirts, sweatshirts, windbreaker or jacket (for cool mornings & evenings)
- Raincoat / poncho (in case of rain)
- Modest swimsuits - swimming trunks (guys); no bare midriffs (ladies)
- Beach towels (**Note:** lodge bath towels are NOT permitted to be used at Lake / Pool)
- Water shoes, water sandals, or old pair of lace-up tennis shoes (for lake / pool)
- Sunscreen Sunglasses Hat Bug repellent
- Flashlight or headlamp
- For those fishing - fishing gear, tackle, bait
- For those skeet shooting – eye and ear protection (Caraway will provide firearms and ammo)

GENERAL CAMP POLICIES

All camp policies MUST be agreed to by the head of each household at the time of registration.
They are as follows:

Guests must respect the stated beliefs of Camp Caraway by not doing or saying anything that will in any way detracts from those beliefs while on the property.

Guests must wear modest clothing at all times. Modest swimwear is expected at the lake; ladies, no midriffs showing, no high cut legs, and please be mindful of excessive cleavage.

No drugs, including alcoholic beverages are allowed on campus.

Smoking is not permitted in the buildings. Smoking on the grounds is allowed in outdoor, designated areas only.

No swearing or profanity.

Guests may not operate or ride in any all-terrain vehicle, skateboard, roller-skate, rollerblade or ride in the back of a moving vehicle. Guest must not have any firearms, firecrackers, knives, air rifles, etc., on campus.

No pets.

Guests may not possess weapons on Caraway property unless they have been authorized for specific program purposes by Caraway administration. Prohibited weapons include all firearms including air rifles, archery including crossbows, swords, and knives with blades longer than 6 inches, blow guns, tasers, and sling shots.

Guest are prohibited from using dye of any kind, such as hair dye, on the property.

If guests violate any of the prohibited activities, guests will be obligated to pay for any damages and/or be removed from the premises without refund.

If you see anyone in violation of these rules, please contact one of the camp committee members or camp staff.

CHECK IN / CHECK OUT

Anyone arriving AFTER 11:00 pm MUST make prior arrangements with the Caraway Office.


Room Check-in: 3:00 pm / Room Checkout: 10:00 am.
